As you may know, the CBT invests our endowment fund in a fossil fuel free portfolio managed by Genus Capital Management in Vancouver. Our portfolio manager, JP Harrison, will be in Tofino to present at our AGM on May 26th. I thought you might be interested in meeting with him to learn more about their investment strategy given the recent discussion at council about the MFA fund. Genus has been a leader in socially-responsible investing since we began working with them in 2000. I realize there are many limits to how municipalities can invest and know that if any firm was able in innovate to respond to your needs, it would be Genus.
