6. PUBLIC INPUT

6.1 There were no members of the public who wished to speak.

7. REPORTS

7.1 Operating Budget (2018)

CFO Carolyn Bidwell distributed an updated handout on general operating revenues and expenditures to Council members.

Staff answered Council's budget related questions.

- District is not obligated to give permissive tax exemptions.
- The School Board does not pay property taxes.
- Review of Development Cost Charges is underway with a draft bylaw to Council expected this summer.
- Transfers to water and sewer have been corrected.
- Change to water rates occurred in 2016 through a Bylaw.
- Staff still has to provide information on Payment In lieu of Taxes (PILT).
- Cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) is 2%.

Tax Classes:

- Ratios are currently: Residential 1; Commercial 2.74; Recreation 2.92; and Utilities 6.69.
- CFO Carolyn Bidwell recommended setting a rate for all classes regardless of whether the District has them currently.
- Council asked staff what type of property is classified as recreation.
- Council asked staff if there was a different rate for the fish plants, businesses in the industrial area, and properties zoned tourist commercial.

Small Craft Harbour Reserve:

- Transfers to the Small Craft Harbour Reserve has been inconsistent over the last several years.
- There is no bylaw or policy to provide direction on any of the District's reserves. There is no mention of the reserve in the Small Craft Harbour agreement.
- Council noted that they would like to transfer some funds to the Small Craft Harbour Reserve. The amount should be net of all expenditures as well as staff time spent on bylaw enforcement

and administration.

Council provided the following direction to staff:

- Add \$30,000 for economic development to the annual operating budget.
- Provide an updated estimate for property tax revenues based upon the latest BC Assessment role.
- Provide Mill Rate ratios and dollar values for the last three years to show the trend between residential and commercial properties.
- Review the District's asset and liability insurance this year.
- Keep the sidewalk repair budget at \$13,470 for 2018 and consider preparing a long-term plan for sidewalk maintenance and improvements. Staff indicated that the District has purchased a new asset management software that assist with planning.
- The replacement of trucks should be part of the operating budget.

7.2 Projects Review (2018)

PROJECT NAME: Matterson Reservoir Upgrade PROJECT NO: WCP2017-03

Warren Cannon, Superintendent of Public Works, addressed Council's questions regarding the project. An engineering study was completed in 2017 and design work is planned for 2018. Mr. Cannon added that early approval will allow staff to move forward with completing the work in 2018.

2017-004It was moved by Councillor Noel and seconded by Councillor OliwaTHAT Council give early budget approval of \$130,000 for the Matterson

Reservoir Upgrade (WCP2017-03) as part of the 2018-2022 Financial Plan. CARRIED.

7.3 Funding Options

Council noted they would like to have some discussion around the Barkley Community Forest as a possible funding source at the next budget meeting.

Staff to report back at the next budget meeting regarding the availability of gas tax funds to pay for Walkways - Marine Dr. (PWCP2017-01) and WPT Connection Trail - Spring Cove (PRCP2017-01).

7.4 Public Budget Presentation

Council requested that the public budget presentation illustrate the

impact of the proposed 2018 tax rate on residential and commercial properties. Examples to show tax increase scenarios for low, medium, and high property values.

PURPOSE/DESIRED OUTCOME:

The purpose of this report is to seek approval from Council as to the recipients and the amounts to be awarded under the current Grant in Aid Policy.

STRATEGIC GOAL:

This report is in response to the corporate objective of fiscal responsibility as identified in the current strategic plan.

BACKGROUND:

At the March 13, 2018 Regular Meeting of Council, Council reviewed the 2018 Grants in Aid applications from local non-profit organizations. Applicants attended the meeting to speak to their request and respond to Council's questions. Council deliberated final contribution amounts and deferred approval until the March 20, 2018 Special Meeting of Council following discussion of the 2018-2022 Financial Plan.

At the March 13, 2018 Regular Meeting, Council approved funding applications for Council contribution requests for facility use and lease payments approximating \$47,648. The amount was calculated based on the 2018 recreation fee schedule.

OPTIONS:

- **1.** THAT Council award \$16,375 in Grants in Aid funding for 2018 as outlined in the attached Appendix A Council Grants in Aid Requests 2018.
- **2.** THAT Council amend individual Grants in Aid award amounts and approve the attached Appendix A Council Grants in Aid Requests 2018 as amended.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS:

Currently there is \$20,000 within the Grant in Aid budget to be used as per the policy and at Council's discretion.
