PURPOSE:

To provide the Harbour Authority with an update regarding the Ucluelet Harbour Master Plan.

BACKGROUND:

The purpose of the Ucluelet Harbour Master Plan (the "Plan") is to provide a vision for the harbour that meets the community's needs and provides pathways for implementation. The Plan supports the vision, goals and objectives of the 2018 Official Community Plan, 2017 Economic Development Plan and 2019-2022 Strategic Plan.

The process for developing the plan is as follows:

- 1. Project initiation and background review
- 2. Site inventory and analysis
- 3. Key partner & stakeholder engagement
- 4. Draft Harbour Master Plan report
- 5. Focused virtual group meetings
- 6. Finalize and submit Harbour Master Plan report

The Plan will be an inclusive and user-friendly document to guide future decision making and support upcoming funding opportunities. It will also strive to meet the dual requirements of DFO and DoU and comply with all applicable legislation, while balancing the unique needs of key partners & stakeholders, including but not limited to commercial and sport fisheries, First Nations, and tourism and recreational users.

- Survey / questionnaire (paper/online)
- Handouts (informally through Manager of Recreation & Tourism and Harbour Manager)

- Virtual group meetings (e.g. commercial fishermen, tourism operators)
- Coordination with Department of Fisheries & Oceans (DFO)
- Share final Harbour Master Plan with the community

RECOMMENDATION(S):

- 1. **THAT** the Harbour Authority approve the Harbour User Agreement between the District of Ucluelet and the Western Canada Marine Response Corporation with a term from October 1, 2020 to January 3, 2022.
- 2. **THAT** the Harbour Authority approve the Letter of Intent for the Harbour User Agreement related to the Subject Premises (Ucluelet West Harbour Outer Boat Basin Float C) between the District of Ucluelet and the Western Canada Marine Response Corporation.

PURPOSE:

To provide the Harbour Authority with the background information regarding the recommendation to approve the Western Canada Marine Response Corporation (WCMRC) Harbour User Agreement and Letter of Intent.

BACKGROUND:

WCMRC is the Transport Canada-certified marine spill response organization for Canada's west coast. Their mandate under the Canada Shipping Act is to be prepared to respond to marine oil spills along all 27,000 km of British Columbia's coastline, and to mitigate the impact when a spill occurs. This includes the protection of wildlife, economic and environmental sensitivities, and the safety of both the responders and the public. WCMRC is currently in the process of establishing a satellite base in Ucluelet.

The WCMRC wishes to enter into an agreement with the Harbour Authority for the purpose of moorage of its vessels along the last 32.92m (108 feet) on both sides of Float "C" of the Outer Boat Basin and the installation of a security gate at the entrance to that portion of the dock (See Appendix A: Harbour User Agreement).

This Letter of Intent ("LOI") between the DoU and WCMRC establishes that the DoU is prepared to pursue the New Agreement with WCMRC if the DoU enters a New Head Lease with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) for the subject premises. The terms of New Agreement will be determined by good faith negotiations between the DoU and WCMRC (see Appendix B).

Stephanie Paterson Regional Manager, Client Services, Small Craft Harbours, DFO, has reviewed the agreement and had not no questions or concerns.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS:

The moorage rate was determined by researching similar jurisdictions. The rates are based on Port Alberni's Harbour Authority. WCMRC has accepted the proposed rates as per the table below.

HARBOUR USER AGREEMENT

Ucluelet West Small Craft Harbour

BETWEEN:

District of Ucluelet, incorporated as a corporation without share capital under the *Local Government Act*, carrying on business at PO Box 999, 200 Main Street, Ucluelet, B.C. V0R 3A0;

(the "Harbour Authority")

AND: Western Canada Marine Response Corporation ("WCMRC")

Head Office 206 – 3500 Gilmore Way Burnaby, B.C. V5G 0B8

(the "Harbour User")

WHEREAS:

- A. Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, entered into a head lease agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Head Lease"), with the Harbour Authority, bearing number 0112PB03, covering a water lot more commonly known as "Ucluelet West Small Craft Harbour" (hereinafter referred to as the "Leased Area") outlined in red on Schedule "A-1", commencing on January 4th, 2002 with three (3) five (5) year renewal options. The current term expires on January 3rd, 2022
- B. The Harbour User wishes to enter into an agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "User Agreement"), with the Harbour Authority for the purpose of moorage of its vessels, installation of a security gate at the entrance to that portion of the float, for the Harbour User's assets at the last 32.92m (108 feet) on both sides of Float "C" (hereinafter referred to as the "User Area") outlined in red on Schedule "A-2".
- C. The parties have agreed to enter into the User Agreement, subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - 1. The Harbour Authority hereby gives permission to the Harbour User, without right of assignment to any other party, to enter upon the Leased Area and use the User Area for vessel moorage and gate installation purposes as described in Section B.
 - 2. The term (hereinafter referred to as the "Term"), of the User Agreement shall commence on **October 1, 2020** and terminate on **January 3, 2022**.
 - 3. The Harbour Authority accepts and agrees as follows:

- a) To permit the Harbour User to enter upon, use and occupy the User Area for the purposes described as follows:
 - i. To install a gated partition at the entrance to the User Area;
 - ii. To maintain and operate vessels owned by the Harbour User; and
 - iii. For any other purposes deemed necessary in connection with the Harbour User's operations and agreed by the Harbour Authority in writing (hereinafter referred to as the "User Purposes").
- 4. The Harbour User hereby accepts and agrees as follows:
 - a) To pay to the Harbour Authority, in advance, an annual user fee of \$22,630.40 plus G.S.T., (the "User Fee") or prorated portion thereof, which must be made payable to the "District of Ucluelet" as follows:
 - i. the first User Fee of \$22,630.40 plus \$1067.47 G.S.T., is due on October 1, 2020; and,
 - ii. second prorated User Fee of \$5,908.24 (91/365 * 22,630.40) plus \$266.14 GST is due on October 1, 2021.
 - b) To moor its vessels located within the User Area in such a manner that they will not restrict access by employees or officers of the Harbour Authority to the Leased Area or the harbour generally.
 - c) Not to restrict emergency access to the User Area, either by the Minister, any members of the Harbour Authority, first responders or emergency personnel, which also extends to any staff associated with the Harbour User who may be present, who will be responsible for quickly clearing the User Area to the extent required by any of the aforementioned emergency personnel.
 - d) To abide by all lawful rules, regulations and bylaws of municipalities, and other governing bodies, in any manner in connection with the User Area, or any other facilities surrounding the User Area, such as ramps or docks.
 - e) At all times, to indemnify and save harmless the Harbour Authority, its employees or officers, and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, and any successor entity, agency or department, from and against all claims and demands, losses, costs, damages, actions, suits or other proceedings by whomsoever made, brought or prosecuted, in any manner based upon,

occasioned by or attributable to the Harbour User's operations and use or occupation of the Leased Area and User Area, (including the use or occupation of the Leased Area and User Area by the Harbour User's agents, contractors, employees and guests), except claims for damage resulting solely from the negligence of any officers or employees of the Harbour Authority while acting within the scope of their duties or employment.

- f) Not to do, allow or permit any act or thing which may impair, damage or injure the User Area, or any part thereof, beyond wear and tear occasioned by reasonable use and shall, at its own cost and expense, repair and renew in a good, sufficient and workmanlike manner all portions of the User Area which may at any time be damaged by the Harbour User, its employees, agents, contractors, and guests and, in the event of the failure of the Harbour User to carry out such repairs or renewals, the Harbour User shall indemnify and save harmless the Harbour Authority from all damages, costs and expenses suffered or incurred by the Harbour Authority by reason of such impairment.
- g) To maintain public liability and property damage insurance against any claims for personal injury, death or damage to property which might arise out of the Harbour User's operations or use of the User Area. Such insurance shall be in an amount of \$5,000,000.00 (Five Million Dollars) and shall include the "District of Ucluelet" and "Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans", as named or additional named insureds. The Harbour User shall provide proof of such insurance to the Harbour Authority.
- h) Not to construct or erect any building, installation, structures and any other works on the User Area or make any alterations or improvements, without the prior written approval of the Harbour Authority.
- i) This User Agreement, or any rights hereunder, shall not be transferred to any other party, including the transfer of ownership of the Harbour User or the vessels, without the written approval of the Harbour Authority.
- j) To provide the Harbour Authority with proof of an active business licence upon request.
- k) To ensure that each vessel the Harbour User causes or allows to be kept in the User Area maintains hull and machinery, protection and indemnity and pollution response insurance.
- Not to moor vessels or store items outside of the User Area without the written permission of the Harbour Authority and in the event it moors vessels or stores items outside of the User Area with the permission of the Harbour Authority, to pay to the Harbour Authority such rates as the

Harbour Authority typically charges for such services unless otherwise agreed in writing.

- 5. The Harbour Authority hereby grants to the Harbour User, and its licensees, agents, servants, employees, contractors and workmen and all persons authorized by them, the non-exclusive right and contractual license for the term of this Harbour User Agreement and at all times:
 - a) To enter, go, pass and re-pass upon the over the Leased Area at all times by day and night, with or without vehicles (including without limitation spill response vessel), machinery or equipment and any materials or supplies for the purpose of access to the User Area for the purpose of carrying out or conducting the permitted use set out in section 3 (a) of this Harbour User Agreement; and,
 - b) To enter, go, pass and re-pass upon and over the float walkway located within the Leased Area at all times by day and night, with or without machinery or equipment and any materials or supplies for the purpose of access to the User Area for the purpose of carrying out or conducting the permitted use set out in section 3 (a) of this Harbour User Agreement.
- 6. The employees, contractor, officers or nominees of the Harbour Authority shall, at all times and for all purposes, have full and free access to the User Area, concurrently with the Harbour User, for any purposes, including but not limited to, inspections of the Harbour User operations and activities within the User Area.
- 7. If the Harbour User commits any breach or default in the performance of any obligation under this User Agreement, the Harbour Authority may deliver a notice of the breach or default. If the breach or default occurs a second time, and a previous breach or default has been logged, the Harbour Authority may terminate this Harbour User Agreement, with immediate effect, by giving 30 days notice to the Harbour User, in writing, at the address contained in Article 9.
- 8. By at any time choosing not to enforce a term of this Harbour User Agreement, the Harbour Authority does not waive its right to, at any time thereafter, enforce the same clause.
- 9. Notice may be given by the Harbour User in writing and delivered or mailed to the Harbour Authority at:

District of Ucluelet PO Box 999 200 Main Street Ucluelet, B.C. VOR 3A0 Notice may be given by the Harbour Authority in writing, delivered or mailed to the Harbour User at:


- 10. Upon cancellation or termination of this User Agreement, the User Area is to be left as nearly as possible in the same or better condition than it was in at the commencement of the Term, with the exception of the security gate installed by the Harbour User, which the Harbour Authority may at its option require the Harbour User to leave in place. Upon 21 (twenty-one) days' notice, the vessels, and any associated gear or equipment associated with the Harbour User's operations which may be left on the User Area, shall, at the Harbour Authority's option, become the property of and vest in the Harbour Authority, without any right to compensation on the part of the Harbour User therefor. The Harbour Authority may also, at its option, remove and dispose of the vessels and any equipment or other materials, in which case the Harbour User shall upon demand forthwith repay and reimburse the Harbour Authority for all costs and expenses connected therewith or incidental to such removal and disposal.
- 11. Any amendment to this User Agreement must be made in writing and executed by both the Harbour Authority and Harbour User and are subject to Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, approval.
- 12. This User Agreement terminates and supersedes all other agreements and arrangements between the Harbour Authority and the Harbour User regarding its subject.
- 13. The Harbour User agrees that the User Agreement is a non-exclusive contractual agreement and that it does not grant any leasehold or other property rights or interest in the User Area.
- 14. The Harbour Authority shall have the sole discretion to determine if the Harbour User is using the User Area in compliance with the Purposes set out in Article 4.
- 15. As security for the full and faithful performance of all the obligations of the Harbour User under this Lease, Harbour User shall maintain in full force and effect throughout the Term, an irrevocable, standby letter of credit (the "Letter of Credit") in favor of Harbour Authority or its successors or assigns, with a national lending institution that is reasonably acceptable to Landlord (the "Lender"), in the amount of \$11,815. On or before September XX, 2020, Harbour User shall deliver the Letter of Credit to Harbour Authority, which Letter of Credit shall be in a form reasonably acceptable to Harbour Authority, Lender and Harbour User.


SCHEDULE "A-1"

Further to our recent conversations and correspondence regarding the proposed Harbour User Agreement between the DoU and WCMRC with a term that expires on January 3, 2022, in which:

- WCMRC expressed a desire to lease 108 feet on both sides of Float C at a water lot more commonly known as the Ucluelet West Harbour Outer Boat Basin (the "Subject Premises") which the District Leases from the DFO;
- WCMRC expressed its desire to lease the Subject Premises for a ten-year term;
- DoU cannot offer a ten-year term because the Head Lease with the DFO expires on January 3, 2022;
- the DFO confirmed its intention to enter into a new Head Lease (the "New Head Lease") with the DoU that would commence on January 4, 2022; and
- WCMRC expressed its desire to enter into a new Harbour User Agreement (the "New Agreement") for the sublease of the Subject Premises with the DoU which would commence on January 4, 2022.

This Letter of Intent ("LOI") between the DoU and WCMRC establishes that the DoU is prepared to pursue the New Agreement with WCMRC, if the DoU enters a New Head Lease with the DFO for the Subject Premises. The terms of New Agreement will be determined by good faith negotiations between the DoU and WCMRC.

<u>Good Faith Negotiations:</u> For a three month period commencing immediately after the DoU enters into the New Head Lease, the parties will act honestly, diligently and in good faith in their respective efforts to negotiate, settle and execute the New Agreement. The DoU will not, and will cause its affiliates and related parties not to, directly or indirectly, initiate solicit or take any other action to encourage or facilitate or induce the making of any offer or proposals, or participate in an discussion or negotiations, relating to the Subject Premises to any party other than WCMRC for this three month period.

<u>Not a Binding Agreement:</u> This LOI does not create a binding contract. It establishes that the DoU is prepared to pursue the New Agreement. Only a definitive Harbour User Agreement, signed by the DoU and WCMRC will be a binding contract.
